



## CLYLP COMCAST FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM

**Deadline to apply for the 2018 CLYLP Comcast Fellowship is Friday, April 6, 2018, 5p.m. PST.**

### CHICANO LATINO YOUTH LEADERSHIP PROJECT BACKGROUND

The CLYLP is a statewide, community-based volunteer organization founded in 1982 whose mission is to enhance and build the leadership potential of California's youth to build communities and create a stronger more prosperous state and nation. CLYLP programs connect young people with community volunteers, policymakers and professionals to motivate leadership and civic engagement by strengthening cultural identity, self-confidence and community connections; and open doors to academic achievement, career growth, and leadership opportunities.

CLYLP programs provide an opportunity to young people at a crucial moment in their lives to build their capacity and ambition, as well as alter their life courses. CLYLP programs motivate young people to pursue their education and become involved, engaged members of their communities. Moreover, the CLYLP enhances the leadership skills, academic preparation, self-esteem, and cultural awareness of young people.

CLYLP offers high school students four leadership development opportunities across California:

- Sacramento Leadership Conference: a week-long intensive leadership training program in Sacramento, open to 120 students from California high schools;
- San Joaquin Valley Institute: a three-day intensive leadership institute held in Fresno, open to 40 students from the San Joaquin Valley region
- Los Angeles Institute: a three-day intensive leadership institute held in Los Angeles, open to 50 students from Los Angeles County;
- Bay Area Institute: started in summer of 2014, the BAI is a three-day intensive leadership institute open to students from the Bay Area region.

Once a student completes a CLYLP program, s/he joins the CLYLP *familia* of more than 5,000 alumni. CLYLP offers support and unique opportunities open to CLYLP alumni throughout their academic careers, including, scholarships, internships and fellowships.

### THE COMCAST FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM

Through a generous grant from the **Comcast Foundation** and in partnership with the **California Latino Legislative Caucus**, the **California State University, Sacramento-Center for California Studies**, the **University of California Center in Sacramento**, the **University of Southern California**, the **Association of Independent California Colleges and Universities** and the **Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities**, the CLYLP sponsors a four-week fellowship program for seven (7) CLYLP alumni who have completed at least their first-year of college/university studies.

While in this intensive fellowship program, participants will follow a rigorous curriculum that builds on prior training provided by CLYLP that includes:

- Placement in a legislative office as an intern in a role allowing for first-hand experience in the state legislative and budget process;
- An academically designed curriculum focused on the inner workings of California government as well as current and future statewide policy issues;



- Opportunities for close interaction and discussions with leading state policy makers;
- Intensive training around “issues-based organizing” and the factors/strategies influencing policy makers;
- Volunteerism during non-work hours through placement with one of the CLYLP summer conference planning committees.

### WHAT THE FELLOWSHIP OFFERS

- **Scholarship.** Fellows will each receive a scholarship of \$3,000 for the four-week period; these funds will be provided in four (4) installments as part of successful completion of components of the program.
- **Office Placement.** Each fellow will be placed in a legislative office in Sacramento for four (4) weeks and will be assigned mentors to support their internship.
- **Housing & Transportation Arrangements.** The fellows will be provided housing and will have access to public transportation in order to complete their assigned internship at the State Capitol, volunteer at the CLYLP office, and attend academic course sessions in downtown Sacramento. Interns must pay for their public transportation costs (discount public transit fares are available to fellows while they are interning at the Capitol), and the cost of their transportation to and from Sacramento for the Fellowship.
- **Interactions with State Leaders.** Through CLYLP partners, fellows will have the opportunity to engage key leaders in various sectors of California’s life and culture. Site visits and informal gatherings will be provided through the month-long program designed to build community and expand the fellows’ leadership and support network.
- **Leadership Development & Training.** The fellows will receive exposure to a leadership curriculum that includes a focus on the inner workings of California government, the factors influencing policy makers and current and future policy issues facing California taught by academic faculty and leaders within the state. In addition, the fellows will serve in key leadership roles in the final planning of the CLYLP Summer Leadership Conference.

### ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Applicants must fulfill the following requirements to be eligible for the CLYLP Comcast Fellowship:

- Be an alumni of CLYLP (by having completed at least one of the following programs: CLYLP Sacramento Leadership Conference, CLYLP San Joaquin Valley Institute, CLYLP Los Angeles Institute or CLYLP Bay Area Institute).
- Demonstrated leadership in their community since having participated in a CLYLP high school program.
- Completed at minimum one full-time year of college and be returning to their studies as a full-time undergraduate at an accredited college or university.
- Commit to continuously being in Sacramento from **Wednesday, July 11, 2018 through Saturday, August 11, 2018**, and fulfill all the requirements of the program. Weekend travel within these dates is prohibited and will only be approved on a case-by-case basis if discussed and approved prior to the start of the fellowship program.



## FELLOWSHIP TIME COMMITMENT

Please note that the fellowship program is an intensive one-month program, with well-planned and strategically planned activities involving a great number of very important people, most of whom have planned for months for the program and are doing so voluntarily. By applying to participate in this program, you do so with full knowledge that your time will be tightly scheduled throughout the entire month of the fellowship program and as such you will not have very much personal time during the program. If you do not think you can handle this type of opportunity, please do not apply.

### APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

A complete application includes the following:

1. APPLICATION FORM: One-page application form completed.
2. ESSAYS: Responses to the two essay prompts must be a maximum of 1,000 words total. Allocate the word count as you wish. If you choose to respond to one prompt at greater length, we suggest your shorter answer be no less than 250 words.
3. RESUME: Resume must include work, extracurricular, and volunteer experience, not to exceed one page.
4. LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION: Two letters of recommendation from a college/university faculty/staff and/or community leader. The letters of recommendation must be mailed separately or attached with the rest of your materials but must be received by the deadline.

5. TRANSCRIPT: Scan or mail a copy of either an official college/university transcript or a computer generated, on-line transcript that includes the name of the school, your name and grades/credits earned.
