CHICANO LATINO YOUTH LEADERSHIP PROJECT BACKGROUND

The CLYLP is a statewide, community-based volunteer organization founded in 1982 whose mission is to enhance and build the leadership potential of California's youth to build communities and create a stronger, more prosperous state and nation. CLYLP programs connect young people with community volunteers, policymakers and professionals to motivate leadership and civic engagement by strengthening cultural identity, self-confidence and community connections; and open doors to academic achievement, career growth, and leadership opportunities.

CLYLP programs provide an opportunity to young people at a crucial moment in their lives to build their capacity and ambition, as well as alter their life courses. CLYLP programs motivate young people to pursue their education and become involved, engaged members of their communities. Moreover, the CLYLP enhances the leadership skills, academic preparation, self-esteem, and cultural awareness of young people.

CLYLP offers high school students four leadership development opportunities across California:

- <u>Statewide Leadership Conference</u>: a week-long intensive leadership training program in Sacramento, opento 120 students from California high schools;
- <u>Central Valley Institute</u>: a three-day intensive leadership institute held in Fresno, open to 40 students from the Central Valley region
- <u>Los Angeles Institute</u>: a three-day intensive leadership institute held in Los Angeles, open to 50 studentsfrom Los Angeles County;
- <u>Bay Area Institute</u>: a three-day intensive leadership institute held in Berkeley, open to 50 students from the Bay Area region.

THE CLYLP COMCAST FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM

Through a generous grant from the **Comcast Foundation** and in partnership with the **California Latino Legislative Caucus**, the **California State University**, **Sacramento-Center for California Studies**, the **University of California Center in Sacramento**, CLYLP sponsors a four-week fellowship program for CLYLP alumni who have completed at least their first year of college/university studies.

While in this intensive fellowship program, participants will follow a rigorous curriculum that builds on prior training provided by CLYLP that includes:

- Mentorship with an individual in the Capitol Community who can help the Fellow understand the legislative process;
- An academically designed curriculum and assignments focused on the inner workings of Californiagovernment as well as current and future statewide policy issues;
- Opportunities for close interaction and discussions with leading state policy makers;
- Intensive training around "issues-based organizing" and the factors/strategies influencing policy makers;



WHAT THE FELLOWSHIP OFFERS

- **Scholarship.** Fellows will each receive a scholarship of \$3,000 for the four-week period; these funds will be disbursed in installments as part of successful completion components of the program.
- Office Placement. Each fellow will receive a Capitol mentor during the four (4) weeks to support their internship.
- Housing & Transportation Arrangements. The fellows will be provided with paid housing and will
 have access to public transportation in order to complete their assigned internship at the State
 Capitol and attend academic course sessions and policy briefings in downtown Sacramento.
 Fellows must provide (and pay for) their own transportation to and from Sacramento, at the
 beginning and the conclusion of the Fellowship.
- Interactions with State Leaders. Through CLYLP partners, fellows will have the opportunity to engage keyleaders in various sectors of California's life and culture. Site visits and informal gatherings will be provided through the month-long program, designed to build community and expand the fellows' leadership and support network.
- Leadership Development & Training. The fellows will receive exposure to a leadership curriculum that includes a focus on the inner workings of California government, the factors influencing policy makers and current and future policy issues facing California taught by academic faculty and leaders within the state. In addition, the fellows will have the opportunity to participate on a panel during the Statewide Leadership Conference and may have the opportunity to participate in the SLC 'Capitol Day.'

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

the start of the fellowship program.

Applicants must fulfill the following requirements to be eligible for the CLYLP Comcast Fellowship:

Be an alumnus of CLYLP (by having completed at least one of the following programs: CLYLP Statewide Leadership Conference (including the virtual program), CLYLP Central Valley Institute, CLYLP Los Angeles Institute or CLYLP Bay Area Institute);
Demonstrated leadership in their community since having participated in a CLYLP high school program.
Completed <u>at minimum</u> one full-time year of <u>undergraduate</u> studies at an accredited college or university (including community college), and, in the fall of 2025, <u>must be returning to their undergraduate studies as a full-time student at their college or university</u> . Alumni who have previously completed their undergraduate studies and have already graduated are not eligible; alumni who are currently pursuing a Master's or PhD degree are not eligible.
Commit to continuously being in Sacramento from June 26 - July 26, 2025, and fulfilling all the

requirements of the program. Personal weekend travel within these dates is not allowed and will only be approved on a case-by-case basis – in an emergency, or if discussed and approved prior to



FELLOWSHIP TIME COMMITMENT

Please note that the CLYLP Comcast Fellowship is an intensive program, with comprehensive and strategically planned activities involving a great number of individuals, inside and outside of the CLYLP familia, most of whom have planned for months for the program and are participating voluntarily. By applying to participate in this Fellowship, you do so with full knowledge that your Fellowship month will be tightly scheduled, and though personal time will be made available, it will likely be limited. If you do not think you can handle the expectations of this type of opportunity, please do not apply.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

A complete application includes the following:

- 1. **APPLICATION FORM**: One-page application form completed (<u>you do not need to include these rules &background pages in your submitted application</u>).
- 2. **ESSAYS**: Responses to the two essay prompts must be a maximum of 1,000 words <u>total</u>. Allocate theword count as you wish. If you choose to respond to one prompt at greater length, we suggest your shorter answer be no less than 250 words.
- 3. **RESUME:** Resume must include work, extracurricular, and volunteer experience, not to exceed one page.
- 4. **LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION**: One letter of recommendation from a community leader or college/university faculty/staff The letter of recommendation can be mailed separately by the recommenderor attached with the rest of your application materials but <u>must be received by the</u> deadline.
- 5. **TRANSCRIPT:** Scan and attach to your application or have USPS mailed a copy of either an <u>unofficial</u> college/university transcript or a computer generated, on-line transcript that includes the name of theschool, your name and grades/credits earned.
- 6. EMAIL FOR SUBMITTING APPLICATIONS AND/OR LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION: fellowship@clylp.org
 - It is **strongly recommended** that you do NOT wait until the last minute to begin preparing yourapplication.

ELECTRONIC SUBMISSION:

All application attachments must be submitted in PDF format and emailed to fellowship@clylp.org with the subject line: 2025 CLYLP Comcast Fellowship Application for FIRST & LAST NAME.
